FEEDBACK ON HOW TO IMPROVE		

How to get started...

1-**READ the rubric** – which level will you shoot for? *I’ve not yet taught the negative space lesson – that’s coming next week* but you can get started planning and researching

2- **See what a good contour drawing looks like** – Google it!

Search it up – “contour drawing project” – view the “images” tab – but be careful – if it’s not JUST outlines, edges and linear details DON’T use it as an example! Dedicate a page in your sketchbook to the planning, sketching, and media trials.

3-**Subject matter is your choice** – you MUST **draw from life** (you see it for real right in front of you) **or an image** (printed and in your sketchbook NOT on your phone). The BEST idea is to draw something that has a LOT of lines in it:

- your hand (holding an object(s))
- your shoe
- mechanical object(s)
- giraffes/elephants
