Line	a mark made with a point across a surface or space
Shape	an area defined by line or other elements
Form	three-dimensional object; forms can be organic or geometric, real
	or simulated
	name of a spectral hue (ex. blue); spectral hues the eye sees when
	light is reflected off an object; has 3 qualities: hue, intensity and
	value
Value	lightness or darkness of a surface/object
lexture	the way things feel, or look like they would feel if touched (real or
	simulated)
Space	Area above, below, between, inside or around objects (real or
	simulated)


#### Oppenheim, Object, 1936

#### Line practice


Goal: choose media and line to help express a meaning

- Some simple examples











### Your project is bit more sophisticated
